DTaP	Diphtheria, Tetanus (lock jaw), and acellular Pertussis (whooping cough)

Hgb	Hemoglobin (check for anemia)
HiB	<i>Haemophilus Influenzae</i> type B (a major cause of infant meningitis)
HPV	<i>Human Papilloma Virus</i> (a cause of cervical cancer)
IPV	Inactivated Polio (shot form)
Meningococcal	<i>Meningococcus Bacterium</i> (a cause of meningitis) sero groups A,C,Y& W
Men B	<i>Meningococcus Bacterium</i> (a cause of meningitis) sero group B
MMR	Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (German Measles)
Rotavirus	Cause of infantile gastroenteritis and diarrhea
StrpPneu/PCV	<i>Streptococcus Pneumoniae</i> (a cause of meningitis, ear infections, and sepsis)
TdaP	Tetanus (lock jaw), and acellular Pertussis (whooping cough)
Varicella	Chicken pox
